

Maintenance of Licensing Information on Digital Platform

Introduction

Section 27 of the *Regulated Health Professions Act* (2023) establishes the legislative requirements regarding information that must be publicly available on the Official Registry. In addition, Section 9 of the Regulated Health Professions General Regulations (2024) requires that all health professions regulators in the province implement a standard specific to the maintenance of information of a registrant without a licence. Such standard must meet the minimum requirements set by the NS Regulated Health Professions Network under authority of s.19 of the RHPA.

POLICY STATEMENT

- **1.0** NSRCT shall retain on its public website the following information for a minimum of twenty-five (25) years following the date a registrant last held a licence:
 - 1.1 the name, including the preferred name, of the registrant as specified on their licence application or last renewal form;
 - **1.2** the registration number of the registrant;
 - **1.3** the date the registrant last held a licence;
 - **1.4** the category of licence the registrant last held;
 - 1.5 the reason the registrant no longer holds a licence;
 - any conditions or restrictions active as of the date the registrant last held a licence that are not covered by a publication ban;
 - **1.7** any licensing sanctions that are not covered by a publication ban, but not including any expired conditions or restrictions.

- 2.0 NSRCT shall permanently maintain the information set out in section 1 on its public website where a registrant no longer holds a licence due to their suitability to practise.
- **3.0** Despite sections 1 and 2 the Registrar may redact publicly available information if the registrar has reasonable grounds to believe it is in the public interest to do so.
- **4.0** NSRCT shall include on the website a statement directing the public to contact the regulator for information related to a registrant whose information is not available on the website.
- **5.0** NSRCT shall apply this policy retroactively as far as practicable and for no less than five years prior to implementation of this policy.
- 6.0 NSRCT shall maintain information outlined in this policy in an archival form separate from the public website in perpetuity.
