

Zero Tolerance for Sexual Misconduct

Introduction

The NSCCT takes a position of "zero tolerance" concerning all forms of sexual misconduct by registrants of the College. Any act of sexual misconduct is a misuse of power and a betrayal of trust. In recognition of the inherent power differential and vulnerability of clients within the client-therapist relationship, the NSCCT treats all such cases as egregious breaches of the CCPA Code of Ethics (2020) and CCPA Standards of Practice (2021).

STATEMENT OF STANDARD

- **1.0** All complaints to the College regarding sexual misconduct by a registrant will be robustly perused.
 - **1.1** Where there is a finding of either professional misconduct or conduct unbecoming that constitutes sexual abuse, the College will seek the revocation of the counselling therapist's licence.
 - **1.2** Where there is a finding of professional misconduct or conduct unbecoming arising from a finding of sexual misconduct that does not constitute sexual abuse, the College will seek a licensing sanction against the counselling therapist commensurate with the relevant circumstances.
 - **1.3** Throughout the process the College will remain committed to ensuring a fair process that maintains a safe and emotionally supportive environment for clients to disclose their experience.
